Rescission Of DACA: How Current Policy Changes & Court Decisions Impact Undocumented Students Thursday, May 10 ~ 3:00-4:00pm (Eastern)

Overview

When the current administration came into office at the beginning of 2017, a commitment was made that the DACA program would remain in place given that the individuals it serves are mostly college students or college graduates who underwent thorough background checks to establish their eligibility for the program. Unfortunately, the administration did not uphold this commitment and announced the rescission of the DACA program in September of the same year. This decision would ultimately impact nearly 800,000 undocumented students and others currently living in the country and leave these individuals in a perpetual state of uncertainty and fear. While the debate continues about how the country ought to address the more than 11 million undocumented people living in the United States, the 800,000 DACA recipients are left without a path to citizenship, ambiguity about their eligibility for future employment, and the fear that they could be detained and deported at any time. Despite a recent court decision challenging the constitutionality of rescinding the DACA program and ultimately leading to its reinstatement for the time-being, both students and those who aim to serve them are challenged to navigate this constantly changing landscape while students work to pursue their college degrees.

This webinar will provide participants with an opportunity to gain a better understanding of how current policy changes and court decisions impact their undocumented students and describe best practices they can implement to ensure that these students have the necessary guidance, information, and support to achieve their educational, personal, and professional goals.

- Learn what steps they can take on their campus and in their community to shape policies that create greater access to education and employment for undocumented students
- Understand better how to ensure that the undocumented students they serve have access to accurate and reliable information and support
- Learn why it is essential to provide undocumented students with a campus-wide support system of programs, services, and informed individuals
- Identify the individuals that ought to be included in a campus-wide network of undocumented student allies
